NIV - 1978

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?

NRSV - 1989

Do not be mismatched with unbelievers. For what partnership is there between righteousness and lawlessness? Or what fellowship is there between light and darkness?

ESV - 2001

Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness?

TNIV - 2002

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?

Purpose for Fasting under (Johns' Baptism) vs. (Jesus Baptism)

Included is every reference to fasting in the New Testament (except duplicates)

Repetition and Discipline - John

And the disciples of John and of the Pharisees used to **fast**: and they come and say unto him, Why do the disciples of John and of the Pharisees **fast**, but thy disciples fast not? (*Mark 2:18*)

And she was a widow of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served God with **fastings** and prayers night and day. (Luke 2:37)

I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. (Luke 18:12)

Jesus, the disciples, nor the apostles ever allude to fasting as a repetitive discipline

But the days will come, when the bridegroom shall be taken away from them, and then shall they **fast** in those days. (*Luke 5:35*)

And Cornelius said, Four days ago I was fasting until this hour;

and at the ninth hour I prayed in my house, and, behold, a man stood before me in bright clothing, ³¹And said, Cornelius, thy prayer is heard, and thine alms are had in remembrance in the sight of God. (*Acts 10:30-31*)

And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away. (Acts 13:3)

And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with **fasting**, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed. (*Acts 14:23*)

And when he had fasted forty days and forty nights, he was afterward an hungred. (Matthew 4:2)

That thou appear not unto men to **fast**, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly. (*Matthew 6:18*)

Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting. (Matthew 17:21)

And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. (Mark 9:29)

Defraud ye not one the other, except it be with consent for a time, that ye may give yourselves to **fasting** and prayer;

and come together again, that Satan tempt you not for your incontinency. (1 Corinthians 7:5)

Giving no offence in any thing, that the ministry be not blamed:

⁴But in all things approving ourselves as the ministers of God, in much patience, in afflictions, in necessities, in distresses, ⁵In stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labours, in watchings, in **fastings**;

⁶By pureness, by knowledge, by longsuffering, by kindness, by the Holy Ghost, by love unfeigned, ⁷By the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armour of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, ⁸By honour and dishonour, by evil report and good report: as deceivers, and yet true;

⁹As unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and, behold, we live;

as chastened, and not killed;

¹⁰As sorrowful, yet alway rejoicing;

as poor, yet making many rich;

as having nothing, and yet possessing all things. (2 Corinthians 6:3-10)
